



Republican Precinct Chairs

Q. How do I file to run for precinct chair?

A. An application must be filed with your county chair before December 8, 2025 at 6:00 p.m.

Q. Where do I find the application?

A. [Texas Secretary of State's website](#)

Q. What do I do with the application?

A. (1) Complete the application. (2) Have the application notarized (the county party may have a notary available). (3) File the application with your county chair before December 8, 2025 at 6 p.m.

Q. What happens if I am the only candidate?

A. If only one candidate files for precinct chair, that person is declared elected and their name does not appear on the ballot.

Q. When do I take office?

A. All elected precinct chairs, whether opposed or not, take office 20 days after the primary runoff election, which is on May 26, 2026.

Q. What do precinct chairs do?

A. Precinct chairs: represent the Republican Party in the precinct; identify and register voters in the precinct; turn out the vote in the precinct; serve on the County Executive Committee; work the elections; and run the precinct convention

Q. How long do precinct chairs serve?

A. Precinct chairs are elected during the primary election in even numbered years and serve for two years

Q. Am I eligible to serve as a precinct chair?

A. To be eligible for precinct chair, a person must:

- Be a resident of the precinct, and a qualified voter of the county
- Not be a county, state, or federal public officeholder or candidate for such office
- Be affiliated with the Republican Party
